

DIRECTIONS TO THE VENUE - SAT NAV POSTCODE LE14 3TL

From the North West: Leave M1 at Junction 24 and folow A6 Loughborough, through Kegworth to Hathern. Turn left on to A6006 (signed for Rempstone and Melton Mowbray). Pass through villages of Zouch, Rempstone and Wymeswold to Asfordby. At start of Asfordby by-pass turn **RIGHT** (signed Asfordby, Frisby) then turn immediately **RIGHT AGAIN** (signed Frisby and Hoby). Venue is approx half mile on the left.

From the North East: Leave the A1 at Newark on to the A46 towards Leicester. Turn off the A46 on to the A6006 turning LEFT (signed to Melton Mowbray). At start of Asfordby by-pass turn **RIGHT** (signed Asfordby, Frisby) then turn immediately **RIGHT AGAIN** (signed Frisby and Hoby). Venue is approx half mile on the left.

From the West: Take M42/A42 to Ashby, picking up the A512 to Loughborough. Take the A60 (signed to Nottingham) out of Loughborough. TURN RIGHT on to B676 (signed Melton Mowbray) and continue until you reach the junction with A6006. TURN RIGHT on to the A6006 to Asfordby (still signed to Melton Mowbray). At start of Asfordby by-pass turn RIGHT (signed Asfordby, Frisby) then turn immediately RIGHT AGAIN (signed Frisby and Hoby). Venue is approx half mile on the left.

From the South: Leave M1 at Junction 21a (A46 Leicester Western bypass). Follow A46 to junction with A6006 (signed Melton Mowbray and Rempstone). TURN RIGHT on to A6006 (signed Melton Mowbray). At start of Asfordby by-pass turn RIGHT (signed Asfordby, Frisby) then turn immediately RIGHT AGAIN (signed Frisby and Hoby). Venue is approx half mile on the left

From the East: From the A1, take either the A606 or A607 to Melton Mowbray. In Melton pick up A6006 (*signed to Rempstone and Loughborough*). ANNUAL MEMORIAL AWARDS

Club's Memorial Awards will be presented annually, competition is confined to members and Champions are excluded from the four colour awards. The winners will be calculated on points accrued throughout the year - January to December - 3 points for 1st; 2 for 2nd and 1 for 3rd at Championship Shows with CC's on offer for the breed and may be counted from **any** class. However, please note that only the win in the dog's **first** class entered can be counted at any one show. The catagories: -

Dennis and Patricia Rose (Miradel) Memorial for Best White/Cream Mrs Kaye's Memorial for Best Brown or Silver Rita Price-Jones (Frenches) Memorial for Best Apricot/Red Roger Bayliss Memorial for Best Black/Blue

For champions only the **Miniature Poodle Champion of the Year** which will be based on the same class points above but with additional points added 5 for CC and 3 for RCC wins. This will include all champions of all colours.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

The word 'dog' includes both sexes

In the following Definitions a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in Breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials, each partner must, at the time of entry, be a Member of the Club.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. **14th March 2024.** Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes, but when entering for Variety classes wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. First Prizes awarded in any classes defined as 'Special' do not count towards eligibility.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:

(1) Withdrawal: The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulation 20.
 (2) Transfer (a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its breed, colour, sex, weight or height, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height, and in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted, to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.

(b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy, Puppy or Junior class which is over age but under 12 Calendar months, 18 Calendar months or 24 Calendar months respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy, Junior or Yearling class respectively for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height, and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling class respectively to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height. (c) For any other reason than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height. (d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

With these provisos the following are the Definitions of Classes:

MINOR PUPPY: For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the day of the show. PUPPY: For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the day of the show. SPECIAL PUPPY AOC: Same as Puppy with restriction to colour (Any Other Colour than Black) JUNIOR: For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the day of the show. YEARLING: For dogs of twelve and not exceeding twenty four months of age on the day of the show. POST GRADUATE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit or Open classes, whether restricted or not, at shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed. LIMIT: For dogs which have not become Show Champions under the Kennel Club Regulations or under

the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club, or won 3 or more CC/CACIB/CAC/Green Stars, or 7 or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Limit or Open classes confined to the breed, whether restricted or not, at shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed

OPEN: For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the show **SPECIAL OPEN AOC:** Same as Open with restriction to colour (Any Other Colour than Black) **SPECIAL BEGINNERS:** For owner, handler and exhibit not having won a Challenge Certificate or

Reserve Challenge Certificate (or equivalent ie CAC, CACIB, Green Star or Reserves).

VETERAN: For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the day of the Show

NOT FOR COMPETITION: For all exhibits entering the show Not for Competition. Fully vaccinated Poodle puppies aged 4 -6 months may be entered Not for Competition and brought to this show.

registered. Fully vaccinated Poodle puppies aged 4 - 6 months will be accepted.

19 No modification will be made to this Schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.

20 Exhibitors passes will not be forwarded. Exhibitors requiring confirmation of entries should include a stamped addressed postcard.

21 Any owner, competitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling made by dog(s) at any Kennel Club licensed show, within the licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and approaches.

22 The Committee will not be in any way responsible for any claim of injury or compensation either occasioned by or arising out of the holding of the show and by reason of act or default of any person in attendance thereat and it is only on this understanding that entries will be accepted.

23 Every exhibitor making an entry shall be deemed to have agreed to abide by the Kennel Club Rules and Show Regulations.

24 The Committee of The Miniature Poodle Club can accept no responsibility for products advertised or sold by stand holders at the show and exhibitors are reminded that grooming products on sale may not meet the requirements of the Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.

25 The taking of photographs and use of video, cinematography or television equipment in the exhibition premises for sale or reward is strictly prohibited except with the written permission of the Club. The Miniature Poodle Club reserve the right at their absolute discretion to confiscate cameras and/or films for the infringement of this condition. Specific dogs may be photographed only with the approval of the exhibitor. No photography or filming is permitted in breed judging rings whilst judging is actually taking place, however judges may allow it to happen at the end of classes or after Best in Sex or Best in Show etc. are awarded.

26 The Committee is empowered to exclude any dog which is not in a fit state for competition due to disease, vice, natural or other causes, and if such exclusion takes place before or after the dog is judged the entry fee will be forfeited. 27 The Club reserves the right to charge a ± 10 administration fee if a cheque is not honoured by the Bank on first presentation or it has to be returned to an exhibitor or their agent for any other reason.

28 Entry fees, once made, will not be refunded.

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION

1 These regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A42. (a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained thereat. (b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A42.

2 (a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the show. (b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.

3 No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed and nothing can be done except (a) operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee (b) the removal of dew claws of any breed (c) operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown. Nor must anything be done calculated to in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive. 4 The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.

5 An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may however be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club wll substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.

6 Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

All cages must be identifiable. It is now a Kennel Club requirement for safety purposes that owner/exhibitor identification is affixed to all cages and crates throughout the duration of the show.

WARNING AGAINST THE USE OF SOFT CRATES

The Kennel Club would like to draw attention to the potential health and safety implications concerning the use of soft crates at shows as in its view, they do not offer sufficient protection to dogs. Soft crates with dogs occupying them should never be left unattended. Those left at the ringside are a potential hazard particularly when occupied by large breeds, and it has been known for dogs to become distressed and move the soft crates along the floor. The Kennel Club is also aware that there have been instances were dogs have escaped from soft crates.

Miniature Poodle Club - Code of Ethics

The rules of The Miniature Poodle Club stipulate that membership of the Club shall imply acceptance of the Club's Code of Ethics.

The Committee have received approval from The Kennel Club for inclusion of the additional clauses of Ethics which did not appear in The Kennel Club's code, and all members of The Club are required to abide by the combined Code of Ethics as shown below.

THE MINIATURE POODLE CLUB GENERAL CODE OF ETHICS

All members undertake to abide by its general Code of Ethics. Club members:

- 1. will properly house, feed, water and exercise all dogs under their care and arrange for appropriate veterinary attention if and when required;
- 2. will agree without reservation that any veterinary surgeon performing an operation on any of their dogs which alters the natural conformation of the animal, may report such operation to the Kennel Club;
- will agree that no healthy puppy will be culled. Puppies which may not conform to the Breed Standard should be placed in suitable homes;
- 4. will abide by all aspects of the Animal Welfare Act;
- 5. will not create demand for, nor supply, puppies that have been docked illegally;
- 6. will agree not to breed from a dog or bitch which could be in any way harmful to the dog or to the breed;
- will not allow any of their dogs to roam at large or to cause a nuisance to neighbours or those carrying out official duties;
- will ensure that their dogs wear properly tagged collars and will be kept leashed or under effective control when away from home;
- 9. will clean up after their dogs in public places or anywhere their dogs are being exhibited;
- 10. will only sell dogs where there is a reasonable expectation of a happy and healthy life and will help with the rehoming of a dog if the initial circumstances change;
- 11. will supply written details of all dietary requirements and give guidance concerning responsible ownership when placing dogs in a new home;
- 12. will ensure that all relevant Kennel Club documents are provided to the new owner when selling or transferring a dog, and will agree, in writing, to forward any relevant documents at the earliest opportunity, if not immediately available;
- 13. will not sell any dog to commercial dog wholesalers, retail pet dealers or directly or in directly allow dogs to be given as a prize or donation in a competition of any kind. Will not sell by sale or auction Kennel Club registration certificates as stand alone items (not accompanying a dog);
- 14. will not knowingly misrepresent the characteristics of the breed nor falsely advertise dogs nor mislead any person regarding the health or quality of a dog

In addition to the above Kennel Club provisions:

- 15. Members shall not mate any bitch that is less than 18 calendar months of age nor allow their stud dogs to be used on bitches aged less than 18 months.
- 16. Members shall not mate a bitch aged more than 8 years of age except with special permission from the Kennel Club;
- 17. Members shall not mate a bitch after it has had 4 litters;
- 18. Members shall not sell, or allow to leave their premises, puppies which are less than 8 weeks of age;
- 19. Members shall not mate any bitch for more than two consecutive seasons;
- 20. Members shall not have more than two ceasarean sections on any one bitch and these must not be on two consecutive seasons;
- 21. Members undertake to breed stock of good general health and temperament, making use of the Kennel Club Health Schemes pertinent to this breed;
- 22. Members shall always give written dietary, grooming and general health advice when selling a Miniature Poodle;
- 23. Members shall give an undertaking of follow up advice to all new owners as and when required;
- 24. Members shall not be knowingly involved in the cross breeding of Miniature Poodles with any other Breed;
- 25. No member shall knowingly abandon any dog, bitch or puppy.

Breach of these provisions may result in expulsion from club membership, and/or disciplinary action by the Kennel Club and/or reporting to the relevant authorities for legal action, as appropriate. Publication in the Kennel Club Breed Records Supplement shall be required as proof of the facts.

SHOW REGULATIONS

1 The show will open at 8 am

2 Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitors responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.

3 Judging will commence promptly at 9.30 am

4 Exhibits may be removed from the show after their judging has been completed. The show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.

5 The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of tenting and benching areas is forbidden except as authorised by the Show Management.

6 Entry Fees: Members: First entry for each dog £17.00 plus £2.00 for all subsequent entries with same dog

Non-Members: First entry for each dog £19.00 plus £3.00 for all subsequent entries with the same dog. **Not for Competition** £2.00 per dog with entries. **Prepaid Catalogue** £2.00

7 Prize Money will be not be paid at this show

8 The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.

9 Puppies under six calendar months of age on the day of the show are not eligible for exhibition. Fully vaccinated Poodle puppies aged 4 - 6 months may be entered Not for Competition at the owners responsibility.

10 The mating of bitches within the precincts of the show is forbidden.

11 **Best Puppy in Show.** The Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it may, at the discretion of the judge, be awarded Best Puppy in Show respectively. Where the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it may also, at the discretion of the judge, be Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show respectively.

12 **Best in Show.** Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex but only if they have received a first prize in a class at the same show. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.

13 Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.

14 Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them, nor is it acceptable to handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.

15 All exhibitors must be familiar with the Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.

16 All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.

17 DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS. Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the KennelClub offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and dont's travelling to and whilst at their licensed events. When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams. If your vehicle is not air conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all. The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible and plenty of stops should be taken with lots of water available to drink. Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog. When at the show never leave your dog in the vehicle. Keep the dog in the shade, take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated. Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time. Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licenced event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met and should not put a dog's health or welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for diciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations. WARNING: IF YOUR DOG IS FOUND TO BE AT RISK FORCIBLE ENTRY TO YOUR VEHICLE MAY BE NECESSARY WITHOUT LIABILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE CAUSED.

DEFINITIONS OF CLASSES

The word 'dog' includes both sexes

In the following Definitions a Challenge Certificate includes any Show award that counts towards the title of Champion under the rules of any governing body recognised by the Kennel Club. Wins at Championship Shows in Breed classes where Challenge Certificates are not on offer shall be counted as wins at Open Shows.

In the case of a dog owned in partnership and entered in Members' classes or competing for Members' Specials, each partner must, at the time of entry, be a Member of the Club.

In estimating the number of awards won, all wins up to and including the seventh day before the date of closing of entries shall be counted when entering for any class i.e. **14th March 2024.** Wins in Variety classes do not count for entry in Breed classes, but when entering for Variety classes wins in both Breed and Variety classes must be counted. First Prizes awarded in any classes defined as 'Special' do not count towards eligibility.

If an exhibitor reports before the judging of a class or classes that a dog has been entered which is ineligible, the exhibitor may choose one of the following options:

Withdrawal: The dog may be withdrawn from competition subject to the conditions of Regulation 20.
 Transfer (a) If a dog is ineligible for a class or classes as regards its breed, colour, sex, weight or height, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the equivalent class or classes for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height, and in the event of there being no equivalent class, Minor Puppy and Puppy excepted, to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.

(b) For an exhibit entered incorrectly in a Minor Puppy, Puppy or Junior class which is over age but under 12 Calendar months, 18 Calendar months or 24 Calendar months respectively, the Show Secretary shall transfer the exhibit to the Puppy, Junior or Yearling class respectively for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height, and in the event of there being no Puppy, Junior or Yearling class respectively to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.

(c) For any other reason than the above, the Show Secretary shall transfer it to the Open class for the correct breed, colour, sex, weight or height.

(d) If an exhibit arrives late and misses a class, even if it is the only class in which the dog is entered, the dog may not be transferred to any other class.

With these provisos the following are the Definitions of Classes:

MINOR PUPPY: For dogs of six and not exceeding nine calendar months of age on the day of the show. PUPPY: For dogs of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the day of the show. JUNIOR: For dogs of six and not exceeding eighteen calendar months of age on the day of the show. POST GRADUATE: For dogs which have not won a Challenge Certificate or five or more First Prizes at Championship Shows in Post Graduate, Minor Limit, Mid Limit, Limit or Open classes, whether restricted or not, at shows where Challenge Certificates were offered for the breed.

OPEN: For all dogs of the breeds for which the class is provided and eligible for entry at the show

SPECIAL OPEN AOC: Same as Open with restriction to colour (Any Other Colour than Black) SPECIAL BEGINNERS: Dog, owner and handler not to have won a Challenge Certificate or Reserve Challenge Certificate (or equivalent ie CAC, CACIB, Green Star or Reserves) VETERAN: For dogs of not less than seven years of age on the day of the Show

NOT FOR COMPETITION: For all exhibits entering the show Not for Competition.

19 No modification will be made to this Schedule except by permission of the General Committee of the Kennel Club which will be followed by advertisement in the Canine Press wherever possible.

20 Exhibitors passes will not be forwarded. Exhibitors requiring confirmation of entries should include a stamped addressed postcard.

21 Any owner, competitor, handler or other person in charge of a dog is required to remove as soon as possible any fouling made by dog(s) at any Kennel Club licensed show, within the licensed venue and within the environs of that event including car and caravan parks and approaches.

22 The Committee will not be in any way responsible for any claim of injury or compensation either occasioned by or arising out of the holding of the show and by reason of act or default of any person in attendance thereat and it is only on this understanding that entries will be accepted.

23 Every exhibitor making an entry shall be deemed to have agreed to abide by the Kennel Club Rules and Show Regulations.

24 The Committee of The Miniature Poodle Club can accept no responsibility for products advertised or sold by stand holders at the show and exhibitors are reminded that grooming products on sale may not meet the requirements of the Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.

25 The taking of photographs and use of video, cinematography or television equipment in the exhibition premises for sale or reward is strictly prohibited except with the written permission of the Club. The Miniature Poodle Club reserve the right at their absolute discretion to confiscate cameras and/or films for the infringement of this condition. Specific dogs may be photographed only with the approval of the exhibitor. No photography or filming is permitted in breed judging rings whilst judging is actually taking place, however judges may allow it to happen at the end of classes or after Best in Sex or Best in Show etc. are awarded.

26 The Committee is empowered to exclude any dog which is not in a fit state for competition due to disease, vice, natural or other causes, and if such exclusion takes place before or after the dog is judged the entry fee will be forfeited. 27 The Club reserves the right to charge a ± 10 administration fee if a cheque is not honoured by the Bank on first presentation or it has to be returned to an exhibitor or their agent for any other reason.

28 Entry fees, once made, will not be refunded.

REGULATIONS FOR THE PREPARATION OF DOGS FOR EXHIBITION

1 These regulations must be observed when a dog is prepared for exhibition and/or exhibited at any Kennel Club licensed event. Objections may be referred to the General Committee for disciplinary action under these Show Regulations and/or for disciplinary action under Kennel Club Rule A42. (a) A dog found to have been exhibited in breach of these Regulations will automatically be disqualified from exhibition at the show and from any award gained thereat. (b) Unless the exhibitor provides a satisfactory explanation for the dog being exhibited in breach of these Regulations then he/she may be subject to further penalties of either a fine or as listed under Rule A42.

2 (a) No substance which alters the natural colour, texture or body of the coat may be present in the dog's coat for any purpose at any time during the show. No substance which alters the natural colour of any external part of the dog may be present on the dog for any purpose at any time during the show. (b) Any other substance (other than water) which may be used in the preparation of a dog for exhibition must not be allowed to remain in the coat or on any other part of the dog at the time of exhibition.

3 No act or operation which alters the natural conformation of a dog or any part thereof may be performed and nothing can be done except (a) operations certified to the satisfaction of the General Committee (b) the removal of dew claws of any breed (c) operations to prevent breeding provided that such operations are notified to the Kennel Club before neutered dogs are shown. Nor must anything be done calculated to in the opinion of the General Committee to deceive. 4 The General Committee without previous notice may order an examination of any dog or dogs at any Show. Any examination thus ordered will be made by a person having executive authority who shall have a written directive from the Kennel Club in their possession. Samples may be taken for further examination and analysis.

5 An individual has the right to lodge an objection to a dog only if he/she is the owner or handler of a dog competing in the same breed or class. An objection may however be lodged by an official of the Show or by anyone so deputed by the Kennel Club. It will be the responsibility of the individual who lodges the objection or the official (as appropriate) to substantiate the grounds for the objection. The Kennel Club wll substantiate the grounds for an objection made on its behalf.

6 Any objection by an individual related to an infringement of these Regulations must be made in writing to the Show Secretary at his/her office before the close of the Show and the individual must produce evidence of identity at the time of lodging the complaint.

All cages must be identifiable. It is now a Kennel Club requirement for safety purposes that owner/exhibitor identification is affixed to all cages and crates throughout the duration of the show.

WARNING AGAINST THE USE OF SOFT CRATES

The Kennel Club would like to draw attention to the potential health and safety implications concerning the use of soft crates at shows as in its view, they do not offer sufficient protection to dogs. Soft crates with dogs occupying them should never be left unattended. Those left at the ringside are a potential hazard particularly when occupied by large breeds, and it has been known for dogs to become distressed and move the soft crates along the floor. The Kennel Club is also aware that there have been instances were dogs have escaped from soft crates.

REFRESHMENTS WILL BE AVAILABLE

Miniature Poodle Club - Code of Ethics

The rules of The Miniature Poodle Club stipulate that membership of the Club shall imply acceptance of the Club's Code of Ethics.

The Committee have received approval from The Kennel Club for inclusion of the additional clauses of Ethics which did not appear in The Kennel Club's code, and all members of The Club are required to abide by the combined Code of Ethics as shown below.

THE MINIATURE POODLE CLUB GENERAL CODE OF ETHICS

All members undertake to abide by its general Code of Ethics. Club members:

- 1. will properly house, feed, water and exercise all dogs under their care and arrange for appropriate veterinary attention if and when required;
- 2. will agree without reservation that any veterinary surgeon performing an operation on any of their dogs which alters the natural conformation of the animal, may report such operation to the Kennel Club;
- 3. will agree that no healthy puppy will be culled. Puppies which may not conform to the Breed Standard should be placed in suitable homes;
- 4. will abide by all aspects of the Animal Welfare Act;
- 5. will not create demand for, nor supply, puppies that have been docked illegally;
- 6. will agree not to breed from a dog or bitch which could be in any way harmful to the dog or to the breed;
- will not allow any of their dogs to roam at large or to cause a nuisance to neighbours or those carrying out official duties;
- 8. will ensure that their dogs wear properly tagged collars and will be kept leashed or under effective control when away from home;
- 9. will clean up after their dogs in public places or anywhere their dogs are being exhibited;
- 10. will only sell dogs where there is a reasonable expectation of a happy and healthy life and will help with the rehoming of a dog if the initial circumstances change;
- 11. will supply written details of all dietary requirements and give guidance concerning responsible ownership when placing dogs in a new home;
- 12. will ensure that all relevant Kennel Club documents are provided to the new owner when selling or transferring a dog, and will agree, in writing, to forward any relevant documents at the earliest opportunity, if not immediately available;
- 13. will not sell any dog to commercial dog wholesalers, retail pet dealers or directly or in directly allow dogs to be given as a prize or donation in a competition of any kind. Will not sell by sale or auction Kennel Club registration certificates as stand alone items (not accompanying a dog);
- 14. will not knowingly misrepresent the characteristics of the breed nor falsely advertise dogs nor mislead any person regarding the health or quality of a dog

In addition to the above Kennel Club provisions:

- 15. Members shall not mate any bitch that is less than 18 calendar months of age nor allow their stud dogs to be used on bitches aged less than 18 months.
- 16. Members shall not mate a bitch aged more than 8 years of age except with special permission from the Kennel Club;
- 17. Members shall not mate a bitch after it has had 4 litters;
- 18. Members shall not sell, or allow to leave their premises, puppies which are less than 8 weeks of age;
- 19. Members shall not mate any bitch for more than two consecutive seasons;
- 20. Members shall not have more than two ceasarean sections on any one bitch and these must not be on two consecutive seasons;
- 21. Members undertake to breed stock of good general health and temperament, making use of the Kennel Club Health Schemes pertinent to this breed;
- 22. Members shall always give written dietary, grooming and general health advice when selling a Miniature Poodle;
- 23. Members shall give an undertaking of follow up advice to all new owners as and when required;
- 24. Members shall not be knowingly involved in the cross breeding of Miniature Poodles with any other Breed;
- 25. No member shall knowingly abandon any dog, bitch or puppy.

Breach of these provisions may result in expulsion from club membership, and/or disciplinary action by the Kennel Club and/or reporting to the relevant authorities for legal action, as appropriate. Publication in the Kennel Club Breed Records Supplement shall be required as proof of the facts.

SHOW REGULATIONS

1 The show will open at 12 noon

2 Dogs will be received at any time but it is the exhibitors responsibility to ensure that exhibits are available for judging when required.3 Judging will not commence before 1.00 pm

4 Exhibits may be removed from the show after their judging has been completed. The show will close half an hour after all judging has been completed.

5 The use of cooking stoves in the proximity of tenting and benching areas is forbidden except as authorised by the Show Management.

6 Entry Fees: **Members:** First entry for each dog £7.00, £1.00 all subsequent entries with same dog **Non-Members**: First entry for each dog £8.00, £2.00 all subsequent entries with the same dog. **Not for Competition** £2.00 per dog with entries. **Prepaid Catalogue** £2.00

7 Prize Money will be not be paid at this show

8 The Committee reserves to itself the right to refuse entries.

9 Puppies under six calendar months of age on the day of the show are not eligible for exhibition. Fully vaccinated Poodle puppies aged 4 - 6 months may be entered Not for Competition at the owners responsibility.

10 The mating of bitches within the precincts of the show is forbidden.

11 **Best Puppy in Show.** The Best Puppy in Show is a puppy which has competed and is unbeaten by any other puppy exhibited at the same show. A puppy is a dog of six and not exceeding twelve calendar months of age on the first day of the Show. Where the Best in Show is a puppy it may, at the discretion of the judge, be awarded Best Puppy in Show respectively. Where the Reserve Best in Show is a puppy which has only been beaten by an adult dog it may also, at the discretion of the judge, be Best Puppy in Show respectively. Consequently, selection of Best Puppy in Show must follow the selection of Best in Show respectively.

12 **Best in Show.** Best in Show must be selected from the exhibits declared Best of Sex but only if they have received a first prize in a class at the same show. If a Reserve Best in Show is to be selected, the eligible dogs are those declared Best Opposite Sex and the Reserve Best of Sex to the exhibit declared Best in Show.

13 Exhibits will not be admitted to Best in Show competition after a period of ten minutes has elapsed since the announcement that exhibits are required for judging, unless they have been unavoidably delayed by previous judging not being completed on time and then only with the special permission of the Show Management.

14 Exhibitors must not pick up dogs by their tails and leads when lifting them, nor is it acceptable to handle a dog in a manner which causes its feet not to touch the ground when on the move. This is not acceptable. Exhibitors should note that such practice would constitute harsh handling and reports of such practice will be referred to the Committee under Kennel Club Show Regulation F11.

15 All exhibitors must be familiar with the Kennel Club Regulation F (Annex B) Regulations for the Preparation of Dogs for Exhibition.

16 All dogs resident outside the UK must be issued with a Kennel Club Authority to Compete number before entry to the show can be made. All overseas entries without an Authority to Compete number will be returned to the exhibitor/competitor.

17 DOGS IN VEHICLES ON HOT DAYS. Your dog is vulnerable and at risk during hot weather and the KennelClub offers the following guidance to help guide you through the do's and dont's travelling to and whilst at their licensed events. When travelling to a show please take a moment to consider whether the route to the show is on a busy holiday route and leave earlier to avoid increased time in traffic jams. If your vehicle is not air conditioned seriously consider whether travelling to the show is a good idea at all. The vehicle should be as fully ventilated as possible and plenty of stops should be taken with lots of water available to drink. Ensure your dog is not sitting in full sunlight. There should be plenty of free flowing air around the dog. When at the show never leave your dog in the vehicle. Keep the dog in the shade, take your own shade for example a large umbrella and always have plenty of water available to drink so your dog stays well hydrated. Avoid your dog taking part in unnecessary exertion or from standing in exposed sunlight for extended lengths of time. Remember, if you feel hot your dog is very likely to feel much hotter and dehydrated and this could lead to dire results. Please look after your dog's welfare. Anyone whose dog is entered at a Kennel Club licenced event should take all reasonable steps to ensure the needs of their dog(s) are met and should not put a dog's health or welfare at risk by any action, default, omission or otherwise. Breach of Kennel Club Regulations in this respect may be referred to the General Committee for diciplinary action under Kennel Club Rules and Regulations.
